LiveWell Initiative LWI, a public health NGO, is a registered health-promotion focused organisation, which empowers the people through health literacy.

Vision Statement: To halve health-illiteracy in Africa by the year 2030; and to increase the life expectancy of the people to 70 by the year 2030.

Mission Statement: To improve the health status of the people of Africa through wellness promotion and health-empowerment and thereby positively influence their health-seeking behaviour.

Corporate Culture: Transparency, Accountability and Ethics.

GOAL: Since inception in 2007, LWI has reached over 1.5 million Nigerians and 3,000 Ghanaians directly and indirectly by proxy contact, inclusive of over 60 blind and disabled adults. The goal of LWI is to increase the life expectancy of Africans especially Nigerians to age 70 by the year 2030 through its unique health empowerment programmes. To achieve this, LWI created a programme for every Nigerian and every citizen of the world, rich or poor, young or old, illiterate or literate. This is as evidenced by its programmes, which are culturally tailored to deliver a healthcare package to the people in the markets, taxi parks, mechanic workshops, academic institutions, conglomerates, corporate entities, elite forums, semi-rural, rural and urban communities. Indeed, LWI seeks to reach and touch every Nigerian; and thereafter impacting citizens of the world at large.

The organisation offers free basic health screenings, community health outreaches, health missions and health fairs, all coupled with free medicines to various communities through its highly qualified team of healthcare experts consisting of public health practitioners, health educators, counsellors, doctors, pharmacists, nurses, community health workers and other trained professionals.

LWI has participated as an Exhibitor in Local, National and International Expositions, Conferences and Meetings, among which are the Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Group of Manufacturers Association of Nigeria (PMG-MAN) Pharma Manufacturers Day, Abuja (2008) and the Nigeria Pharma Manufacturers' Expo by PMG-MAN/GPE Expo Pvt. Ltd., Lagos (2011); West African Health Expo at Eko Hotel & Suites, Lagos (2011, 2013); 2nd GBC Health Annual Conference and Exhibition at the Abuja International Conference Centre, Nigeria (2008); NAPPSA Forum in Atlanta, Georgia, USA; 10th Commonwealth Pharma Congress in Accra, Ghana (2009); ECOWAS Public Private Partnership International Congress, Lome Togo (Nov 2010), HIFA 2015 Congress, London UK (Jan 2011); FIP Amsterdam (2012).

LWI is affiliated with various academic institutions such as the University of Minnesota, Des Moines University Iowa, USA (2009), Babcock University, Nigeria (2009 – date), University of Helsinki, Finland (2012 – date); and has hosted the Emeritus Professor Gary Smith (AZ, USA), a multiple international award winner and faculty Lead, LWI Academy. LWI is in our health empowerment and immunization training programme for healthcare professionals. LWI serves as implementation partners to Access Bank Plc in its Access Care Initiative (2009 – 2010), Stanbic IBTC Bank in its Family Health Fair (Nov 2010), and GlaxoSmithKline GSK in its 'Orange Day' Project (Dec 2011).

LWI is a registered member of the World Hepatitis Alliance and it was recently invited to participate at the Hepatitis in Africa Initiative. The organisation marks World Hepatitis Day annually (2009 – date) and is determined to carry its fight against Hepatitis to the next level in the year 2014, through its active involvement in Advocacy, Awareness Creation, Screening, Research, Data Banking, and Training of the Trainers' Programme in Hepatitis. Its goal is to screen at least 10,000 people in 2014 and to outreach at least 500,000 people through awareness programmes with proactive engagement of the government and key opinion leaders, to influence policy makers towards effective prevention and hepatitis treatment nationwide and around the continent. The organisation has joined hands with the Focus Scientific Research Center (FRSC) to battle Hepatitis by sharing scientific information and expertise available on 'Hepatitis in Africa – Call for Action', in order to better inform all stakeholders for advocacy, training and general awareness on hepatitis in Africa.

LWI Officers: With over 140 Members most of whom are active Volunteer-Officers of the organisation; 8 LWI programme officers won the LBS EBS / Coca Cola Foundation / African American Institute Entrepreneurship Scholarship Award (2010). An LWI officer won a double award, the American Pharmacy Academy Leadership Award (Pfizer Inc, USA) and the Pharmabridge International Exchange Programme Award; another officer won the Goldman Sachs award at the prestigious LBS and graduated in the programme. An LWI officer won a Scholarship to the Women Deliver Congress at Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. LWI boasts of 16 LBS Alumni, 5 first class degree holders and at least 18 Masters Degree holders.

LWI Programmes:

The organisation's programmes are all code-named and are in-line with the Millennium Development Goals MDGs as follows:

IPAP (Illness Poverty Alleviation Programme) *in consonance with the MDG 1 (Millennium Development Goal One), NEEDS (National Economics Empowerment and Development Strategy) and 'Make Poverty History' Global Campaign:* This program is designed for the market women, taxi parks and the mechanics. It teaches healthy living to the less skilled in our society by educating them on the essence of nutrition and balanced diet as well as maintaining a healthy lifestyle; our free health package is also administered.

MEP (Malaria Eradication Programme) *in consonance with the AU (African Union) rollback malaria Plan and MDG6:* The MEP programme is designed to teach people the essence of a clean environment as well as keeping their drainages clean in order to prevent the spread of malaria.

EHES (Executive Health Enlightenment Scheme) *in consonance with primary and promoting healthcare initiatives of 'Healthy People 2010':* This programme is designed for the Executives and Staffers of a company. It seeks to educate the staffs on the essence of living a healthy lifestyle, coping with stress and getting a regular health check, as well as testing their knowledge health wise through our Pre-test and Post-test Questionnaires; and thereafter administer our free healthcare package that includes free basic health tests, personalised health counselling and free non-prescription medicines.

HAEP & DUADES (HIV/AIDS Enlightenment Programme and Drug Use, Abuse and Disuse Enlightenment Scheme) *in consonance with MDG6:* HAEP & DUADES is an in-depth empowerment forum, which is targeted at strongly influencing the pleasure seeking of youth and vulnerable adults. This programme promotes national behavioural change. Condom social marketing is being utilised to promote sexual health among the poor and vulnerable groups.

MIS (Medicines Information Services Centre) *in consonance with the food, drug and poison information centre initiative of governments and the information vacuum created by lack of MIS's (Medicines Information Services) in the nation.* The LWI DIC (Drug Information 'walk-in' Centres) seek to serve as an authenticated resource of drug and health information with a view to enlightening and further empowering healthcare professionals and the lay public on drug and health matters.

Adverse Drug Reactions ADR/Pharmacovigilance; *In consonance with the Health Ministry's Initiative to improve its database on the monitoring and reporting of adverse drug reactions and its pharmacovigilance surveys through NAFDAC, with a view to sensitizing the public and the healthcare community on iatrogenesis (drug induced injury) and its prevention.*

With officers in 4 (four) of the six geopolitical zones, and with the ability to function effectively anywhere within the country or in Africa, Europe and the USA, LWI intends to expand its coverage activities next year to other regions of Nigeria, West Africa and Africa as a whole.



SPECIAL PROJECTS, 2010- 2013:

LBS Training 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013: LWI trained 8 officers at the prestigious Lagos Business School LBS EDS at the 5-month SSM (Social Sector Management) Training under a Coca-Cola Foundation/African American Institute Scholarship and partly-funded by LWI. The trainees popularly known at the LBS as the 'G8', graduated in December 2010. In 2011, two ED's and the CEO attended the LBS Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Training Programme. In April 2013, 5 senior LWI officers including the Regional Manager (North) attended the LBS CSR Training Programme. All trainees were LWI-sponsored.

DAUP (Disabled and Underserved Project) 2010 - date: LWI has procured health insurance for the informal private sector; Starting with Ogudu Zonal Mechanics and school for the Blind in Oshodi under its 'Aloe Vera' and 'Bon Sante' packages respectively. This is an affordable health insurance package for the informal sector, under a discounted CSR (corporate social responsibility) package.

Executive Health, Worklife Balance and Workplace Wellness – *a continuous Value Innovation of LWI (2007 – date):* This is a unique value innovation programme, which is packaged in a personalised and customised way for each organisation. No two programmes are the same. The programme is delivered as a 'turnkey health solution' project, which leaves staffers highly motivated and organisations asking for more. Specialised screenings are also incorporated into the programme.

Grand Health Bazaar GHB2011, GHB2012, GHB2013: GHB2011 the first 3-day cross-cutting, multi-sectoral, carnival-like healthcare exposition in its series was attended by a delegation from the US Consulate General USCG led by Mr Joseph Stafford and at least 60 top dignitaries including at least 20 CEO's from the multi-sectors. The GHB2011 led to the recent emergence of a United Nations Millennium2015 laureate, in the person of the Country Director of Millennium2015 in Nigeria, who won the 'Woman of the Year Global Award' due to the GHB2011 role, and the collaboration-building and powerful advocacy outcomes of the event in the area of Women's eHealth. The GHB2012 was borne out of the need to build 'healthful' bridges of collaboration across the organised private sector OPS, since health is a common denominator in all sectors of the economy. The GHB2012 was more successful than GHB2011 with 192 Exhibitors and 82 companies attending the 3-day event and at least 2,500 participants and delegates. The LWI/BusinessDay health report titled '[Connecting Health to the Work Environment](#)' was launched at GHB2013 by The Hon Minister of Health Mozambique, Dr. Alexandre Manguale, ably represented by the Director of Policy, Dr. Celia Gonçalves. The GHB2013 was attended by over 80 corporate exhibitors and 25 principal partners from multiple sectors of the economy inclusive of the oil & gas, real estate, aviation, health, banking, telecoms, insurance, food and manufacturing sectors; government and non-governmental agencies, among others. LWI HEALTH FAIR LHF2010 LHF2011, LHF2012, LHF2013: The 1st annual LWI Health Fair was in year 2010. LHF2010 attracted an unprecedented attendance of over 6500 people in two days, from Lagos, Kwara, Ogun and Osun States. Free medicines were given to attendees, while over 2000 children were dewormed and over 3,000 women were given haematinics and anti-malarials for themselves and children. At least 30 disabled people attended the fair and they were courteously attended to. The Second Annual 'people-focused' LWI Health Fair LHF2011 themed '*Healthy Nation, Wealthy People*' took place at the Rowe Park Sports Centre Yaba, Lagos from October 13th – 14th 2011. The Rowe Park health Fair attracted at least 8,000 people from all walks of life. The Federal Ministry of Health Abuja, Family Health Division endorsed the LHF2011 and had an exhibition stand at the fair. Led by its Director, Dr. Philippa Momah, the Division encouraged LWI to do even more. The LHF2012 was held as Media Health Fairs over a period of 8 days in four media houses. The LHF2012 were well attended and greatly appreciated by the participants. The 4th Annual self-sponsored LHF2013 with the theme "*Improve lives through patient-centred healthcare*" took place at the Otapete Methodist Cathedral in Ilesha, Osun state to mark Patient Solidarity Day PSD2013 on October 30th 2013. Hon Commissioner Health Osun State Dr. (Mrs.) Temitope Ilori ably represented by Hon PermSec Health Osun state Dr. Fritz Mobolaji Olaoye declared the health mission open. At LHF2013, a 30-man team carried out free healthcare services to the Ilesha people to mark PSD2013.

MICHELLE OBAMA'S "LET'S MOVE", 2011, 2012: LWI launched its Nutrition Enhancement Programme titled "**Project Diabetes**" on March 10th 2011 at the GHB2011 in tune with the 'Let's Move' Initiative for the prevention of obesity and diabetes especially in children. The project was launched with the students of Broadway International School, Surulere, and thereafter at a Children's holiday camp held at Ladybird School, Gbagada. Project Diabetes has reached several schools, encouraging children **to eat healthier and exercise**. The project has evolved into the Schools' Nutrition and Health Programme as well as the Executive Nutrition and Wellness Programme respectively; both of which are in very high demand in Schools and Workplaces. In addition, the Adult Nutrition Programme of



LWI was launched late in 2012, titled 'You Are What You Eat'. With this theme, the programme is centred around dietary approaches to stopping hypertension and chronic diseases. Of recent the programme inculcated genetically modified foods as the debate rages on their advantages or otherwise.

PERSONAL HYGIENE, HANDWASHING AND ETIQUETTE PHHE (2010 – date): This programme assists parents, families and governments in nurturing a better and healthier society through improved hygiene and etiquette. PHHE aims to reduce disease spread and improve societal norms, etiquette, and general health and wellbeing especially among students, schools, women, mothers, food handlers, food manufacturers, children, and society at large. The children's programmes are taught in a very unique and engaging way with chymes and rhymes; and, adults are taught in a unique, captivating, pedagogic language. The programme is getting more popular each day. The OmoniOboli Foundation partnered with LWI in running the programme at the Child Life Line Foundation 'Street Kids' Project.

'easyhealth' – The newest LWI Home Healthcare Project (2012 – date): In January 2012, LWI commenced a FREE Home Healthcare Product, which entailed a monthly home visit to the people who were in need of basic healthcare and basic health checkups. The easyhealth team consists of a pharmacist, visiting nurse and a health officer, with an apex doctor as the team lead. The Hon Commissioner of Health Lagos State, officially launched the mobile health service 'easyhealth' and commended LWI for actualising the product. The product '**easyhealth**' is powered by Stanbic IBTC Mobile Money *909# at Stanbic mobile money account +234 (0) 8023284144. Individuals or corporates can subscribe to easyhealth to improve access to healthcare and to bring healthcare to the comfort of the people's homes and offices. Although initially free, the service is now run at a minimum cost for sustainability.

EBOLA AWARENESS AND SENSITIZATION PROGRAMMES AND OUTREACHES (AUGUST 2014-DATE): In its usual responsive manner, LWI responded proactively to the Ebola Scourge in the West African subspace, by mounting prompt educational programmes for dissemination to members of the public. In all, the organisation has, since the outbreak in August 2014, mounted over 30 (thirty) Ebola outreach and awareness programmes within corporate organisations and to members of the public including low literacy populations. The Ebola Awareness and Outreach Programmes of LWI include the PHHE (Personal Hygiene, Handwashing and Etiquette) and, the organisation has disseminated Flyers, Stickers, Handbills and Posters to improve the people's understanding of the disease. No doubt, the organisation is a formidable ally for would-be partners in fighting the Ebola Scourge to a Halt!
