LWI CEO Update

Greetings to you all - our friends, associates, affiliates, colleagues, and readers. LiveWell Initiative (LWI) is glad to welcome you to its inaugural news bulletin. Since we have programmes all the time (we're always either in a market, park, school, bank, or on the field), our bulletin is long overdue! However, we shall serve to you, 'sumptuous stories of our programmes, events and activities as best

Although we started three years ago with less than 10 people, LWI now boasts of over 100 officers, Volunteers inclusive. We have impacted the lives of over 1 million Nigerians (including over 200 blind people), and over 3,000 Ghanaians, in the period; this includes 'undeserved and disabled' populations; thus leading to our recent inuguration of the LWI DAUP (LWI Disabled And Underserved Project). Our thrust is to improve health literacy, using it as a tool to improve quality and quantity of life, and to improve life expectancy.

LWI recently inaugurated its Health Insurance Project DAUP for the Disabled and Underserved Populations (Projects 'Aloe Vera' and 'Bon Sante'). In addition, we had an unprecedentedly wellattended Free Health Fair which saw an attendance of over 6,000 people in two days!!!...MTN, Nestle, GSK, May & Baker, Evans Plc, Healthcare International HMO, Nutrihealth, Roche Nigeria, were among the 16 companies in attendance at the Health Fair.

Although LWI projects have never been funded by donors, grantors nor government; the programmes are self-sustaining and the organization generates income internally, for sustainability. LWI recently partnered with Access Bank Plc as its Implementation Partners in the Access Care Project. In addition, the organization tutors young GTB Plc Bankers on healthcare and, it is in collaboration with several OPS organizations including FSDH, Skye Bank, PZIL, and Chapelhill Denham among others.

We have visited scores of schools, markets, taxi parks and a few mechanic villages and motor parks around the country including Matori zone, Ojota Motor Park, Ilesha (Osun State), Ojodu retail market and Ogudu village mechanics among others.

Rural trips have taken LWI to Kanke Local Government Area in Plateau State where LWI availed the citizens of free healthcare and ran a free health week in collaboration with the NYSC Plateau State and Kanke Local Government.

LWI has officers in 4 of the six geopolitical zones of the country; however, we have run programmes in all zones; carrying out ARV logistics in the Taraba, Sokoto, Owerri and Nnewi. In addition, LWI has done a lot of work in Lagos, Osun, Ogun, Imo, Abia, Rivers, Niger, and Plateau States as well as Abuja FCT.

At LWI, we build capacity through the 'in-house' LWI Academy which teaches etiquette, poise, language, decorum and attendant managerial and functional skills; thus healthcare delivery at LWI is done with class, decorum, and panache.

The LWI Academy shall be fully launched in the next calendar year, to service the larger public due to great demand, and the fact that 'everybody loves the LWI body-language' and the 'LWI Smile'... At LWI...we implant a Smile!!!

LWI Health Fair

Resounding Success for LWI Free Health Fair as OVER 6000 people attended in 2 days!



LWI held its Health Fair at the Suburb of Gbagada Phase 2 events ground in Lagos, Nigeria on 4th and 5th of June, 2010. The fair was held in hopes of increasing awareness of personal wellbeing, by helping participants become more informed of their health and incorporating a healthy lifestyle in their daily routine.

"The LWI Health Fair '10, the first of its kind for members of the public, was unique & value –added experience for all participants," said Kola Olatunji, Programme Officer External Relations, LWI.

In the last several months before the actual program, LWI staffs and volunteers had been organizing and fine tuning details for this 2 day event.



There were educational information booths and healthy snacks, compliments of LWI members, volunteers and companies who contributed their time and efforts. More than 15 companies were onsite with information to support the fair – MTN, Nestle, GSK, May & Baker, Roche, Evans Plc and Nutri health just to mention a few.

"We are offering participant organizations the opportunity to interface with their clients directly, in a friendly atmosphere devoid of bureaucracy but laden with ethics and conduct," said Pharm. Bright.



LWI provided attendees with informative materials on breast health, stress management and educational materials on disease management.



Other attendees had their sugar levels checked for the first time in their lives and some learned how to adjust their lifestyle to accommodate their health. "The fair is directed at everyone who holds 'good health' dear to their hearts," said Kemi Olaleye, HR/Admin Manager, LWI

A lot of hard work, dedication and team work was exerted in order to pull off an event of this magnitude.

The Main Outcomes of the Health Fair and Benefits to the Public were as follows:

- The theme 'Live Well, Live Long' was embraced by the people

- Over 2, 000 children were de-wormed
- Almost 3,000 women were given Haematinics, Multivitamins and Nutrients including Nido Milk, and non-prescription antimalarials for themselves and for their children; in pursuit of the millennium development goals and the WHO/UN/G8 declaration on Maternal and Child Health (MNCH)
- Over 10 speciality health stands took care of individuals' special needs –men's health, women's health, family health, reproductive health, nutritional health, stress, lifestyle and wellness among others.
- The use of mobile technology came to the assistance of people; as they called friends and relatives from far and near to attend; including as far as Kwara, Ogun &Osun States
- A 46-man LWI team of officers and staff attended to the public; 7 doctors, 12 pharmacists, 8 nurses, 3 microbiologists, 3 public health practitioners, 3 managers and 10 public health internees from Babcock University
