LWI Grand Health Bazaar GHB2013, the multi-sectoral annual exposition with the theme "Sustaining Wealth Creation through Health Solutions and Partnerships", was held on Wednesday April 17th – Friday April 19th 2013 at HAVILAH Centre, Oniru Road, Victoria Island, Lagos, Nigeria.

GHB2013, a '3-in-1' event made up of Plenary sessions, Exposition and an adjoining Health Fair was run on the heels of a very successful inaugural GHB2011 and 'an even more successful' GHB2012 which were both held also on Victoria Island, Lagos. GHB2013 was held out of the need to further foster collaboration between the health sector and the organised private sector with a view to attain mutual synergy between these groups; to bring about improvement of general health and health literacy in our society and enable commerce, corporate networking and synergistic collaborations.

To enhance participation and create a more interactive GHB2013 event, thematic plenary sessions were introduced as follows:

Grand Health Bazaar GHB2013 Pre-event "Wine & Cheese" Cocktail

As a warm up to the GHB2013, the multi-sectoral crosscutting and 'marquee' event of LWI hosted its friends, clients and corporate partners to a "Wine and Cheese" Cocktail event at the Silverbird Galleria, Victoria Island, Lagos. At least 16 companies and 9 corporate Partners attended the pre-event.

Day 1: April 17th 2013: *Oil & Gas / Power Day at GHB2013*

With the sub-theme 'Power and Energy: a Boost to the Eco System and Robust Health'. This sub-theme focused on the oil and gas / power sector. His Excellency Governor of Lagos State Babatunde Raji Fashola, SAN declared the event open through the Hon Commissioner MEMR Lagos State, Engr. Taofeek Tijani, who attended the event with a high-powered team of oil and gas experts, including two Senior Special Advisers to the Lagos State Governor, His Excellency on MEMR.

Day 2: April 18th 2013: Property / Real Estate Day at GHB2013

With the sub-theme 'Building in Safety and Safety in Buildings: a Learning Continuum'. This sub-theme focused on the property / real estate sector, with a view of highlighting the problematic occupational safety and health issues arising in the construction industry. GHB2013 HIGHLIGHTS

LWI CELEBRATES WOMEN AT GHB2013:

LWI celebrated *Womanhood* at the recently concluded GHB2013 by dedicating Day 2: April 18th as 'Women's Health & Nutrition' Day, which was strongly supported by the palpable presence of various Women's Societies including West African Women's Association WAWA led by its President Chief (Mrs.) Beatrice Ubeku, Women Care Association of Nigeria WOCAN, Women's Consortium of Nigeria WOCON led by its President Chief (Mrs.) Bisi Olateru-Olagbegi, ALPS Association of Lady Pharmacists led by Mrs. Modupe Ologunagba, American Women's Club AWC were in attendance. Nestlé's Maggi Kitchen prepared 'freshly cooked' meals for women's groups, schools and other participants at GHB2013.

GHB2013 EVENT STATISTICS:

In all, 80 exhibitors and 141 companies/organisations covered the 3-day event, which was set in a classy and professional ambience. There was a cross-sectoral presence of companies that cut across from the Oil and Gas, Energy, Aviation, Property and Real Estate Sectors, Healthcare Organisations/Clinics to the Pharmaceutical Companies, Banks, Manufacturers, Non-Governmental Organisations NGOs and Foundations, Telecommunications, Food & Nutrition Industry, Beverage Companies, Conglomerates and Commercial Entities.

GHB2013 was a carnival-like event with the presence of organisations from different sectors of the economy. The event was carried out by over 250 officers from over 140 companies/organisations and about 3,000 participants (by daily cumulative contact) numbering just over 1,800 participants by persons attended the event from all sectors of the economy. The turnout of invited dignitaries and exhibitors were as high as 90%. Participants' turnout also met a high expectation and the corporate sector representation was excellent. GHB2013 was by all ratings and feedback, a very successful and impactful '3 in 1' event.

Drivers and Transporters Health

On the 20th of April 2013, LWI carried out an Executive Health Enlightenment Scheme (EHES) programme at Nikky Taurus, a vehicle and driver hire company located at Maryland - Lagos.

The purpose of this programme was to increase the health literacy level of the participants (mostly the drivers) and to positively influence their health-seeking behaviour through educating them on good and bad the peculiarities and health consequences of the 'mobile or immigrant' lifestyle of drivers.

The programme was carried out and it started with a "Nutrition and Wellness" empowerment lecture at 4.00pm, followed by lifestyle and thereafter posture. The lecture was taken by Dr. Bukky Adewakun, a member of the LWI Faculty. The participants asked questions about their health and they were encouraged to modify their lifestyles to suit a healthier outcome. After the Q&A session, the participants were given free health checks with non-prescription medicines.
